## A GUIDE TO CHECKING YOUR BANKNOTE <br> \$1000 Denomination



## 1. Intaglio Printing

Parts of the note are printed in ink raised slightly off the paper. The raised portion can be felt by passing the finger nail over:

1. The denomination.
2. The inner border of the note.

These features are more pronounced on newer notes

## 2. Horizontal numbering

The horizontal numbering has progressively larger digits from the left to right (positioned at the top right hand side of the front of the note)

## 3. See-through feature

When the banknote is held to the light a complete design can be seen. The image on the front is in perfect alignment with the image on the reverse of the banknote.

## 4. Micro Printing

The words 'Bank of Guyana' are micro printed on the bottom border line of the note.
This can only be read with the aid of a magnifying glass. Check to see that the microprinted words are clearly and sharply defined.

## 5. Fluoresces

Look at the note under ultra-violet light to check that the following features fluoresce:
a block containing the number ' $\mathbf{1 0 0 0}$ ', the design at the extreme left and extreme right of the note fluoresces, the centre area at the front of the note.

## 6. Watermark

When the banknote is held up to the light, an image of a macaw is easily seen.

## 7. Wider Security Thread

A colour shift thread is embedded in the note. The complete thread is visible when the note is held up to the light.

## 8. Gold Hologram

The $\$ 1000$ carries a gold based hologram in the shape of the Bank of Guyana's crest (a gold map of Guyana is shown on earlier versions of the \$1000), as the hologram is tilted, many small images of the initials 'BOG', the denomination " 1000 " and the Bank of Guyana's logo can be seen.
