
A GUIDE TO CHECKING YOUR BANKNOTE



1. <u>Intaglio Printing:</u>

Parts of the note are printed in ink raised slightly off the paper. The raised portion can be felt by passing the finger nail over:

- 1. The denomination.
- 2. The inner border of the note.

This feature is more pronounced on newer notes.

2. <u>Horizontal numbering:</u>

The horizontal numbering has progressively larger digits from the left to right (positioned at the top right hand side of the front of the note.)

3. <u>See-through feature</u>

When the banknote is held up to the light a complete design can be seen. The image on the front is in perfect alignment with the image on the reverse of the banknote.

4. <u>Micro Printing</u>:

The words **'Bank of Guyana'** are micro printed on the top border line of the note. This can only be read with the aid of a magnifying glass. Check to see that the microprinted words are clearly and sharply defined.

5. <u>Fluoresces</u>

Look at the front of the note under ultra-violet light to check that the following features fluoresce:

The serial numbers (located at the front), a block containing the number '20' and the center area at the front of the note.
