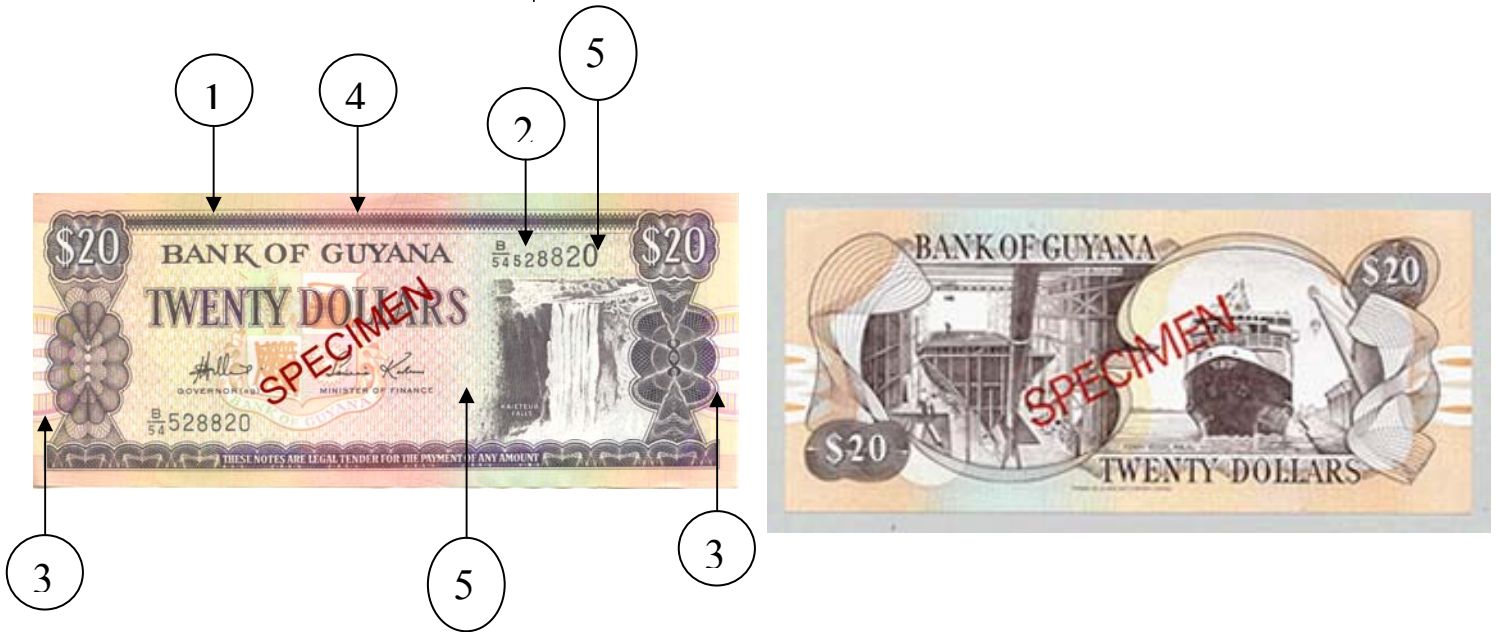


# A GUIDE TO CHECKING YOUR BANKNOTE

## \$20 Denomination



### 1. **Intaglio Printing:**

Parts of the note are printed in ink raised slightly off the paper. The raised portion can be felt by passing the finger nail over:

1. The denomination.
2. The inner border of the note.

This feature is more pronounced on newer notes.

### 2. **Horizontal numbering:**

The horizontal numbering has progressively larger digits from the left to right (positioned at the top right hand side of the front of the note.)

### 3. **See-through feature**

When the banknote is held up to the light a complete design can be seen. The image on the front is in perfect alignment with the image on the reverse of the banknote.

### 4. **Micro Printing:**

The words 'Bank of Guyana' are micro printed on the top border line of the note. This can only be read with the aid of a magnifying glass. Check to see that the microprinted words are clearly and sharply defined.

5. **Fluoresces**

Look at the front of the note under ultra-violet light to check that the following features fluoresce:

The serial numbers (located at the front), a block containing the number '20' and the center area at the front of the note.
